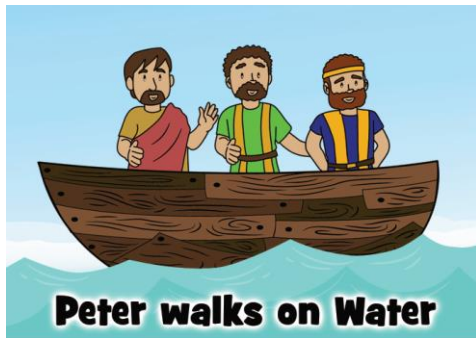


On June 29th we remember the Saints of St Peter and St Paul

Activity – Ask an adult to help you. Fill two clear glasses with water. Stir three tablespoons salt into one of the glasses. Label the salted water "faith" and the plain water "doubt". Next, draw a face on a fresh egg to use for this activity. Gently lower the egg into the "doubt" water and watch it sink. Next, drop the egg in the "faith" water. The egg will float.

In the story Peter floated (faith glass) and then sank (doubt glass). Peter grew afraid, doubted, and sank because he lost his focus on Jesus. What did Peter do when he was sinking? He called out and asked Jesus to save him. We can do the same.



Peter walks on Water

Jesus and his disciples had been busy preaching to crowds and performing miracles.

Jesus wanted some time alone so that He could pray.

He told his disciples to get in the boat and cross the Sea of Galilee ahead of Him.



In the middle of the lake, stormy winds began to blow the disciples boat, and the waves grew high.

Then, all of a sudden, they saw something walking towards them.

The disciples were scared. But then they heard a voice, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."

Peter couldn't believe his ears. It was Jesus. He told Jesus to call Him to come on the water.



Jesus said, "COME."

Peter got out of the boat and walked toward Jesus on the water.

But then He remembered. People can't walk on water.

He saw the storm and began to panic.

He took his eyes off Jesus and began to sink.



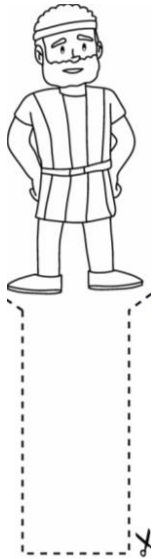
Peter cried out, "Lord, save me."

Everyone in the boat worshipped Jesus, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

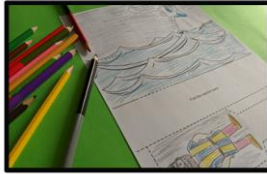
Peter learned He could always trust Jesus.

Scissors

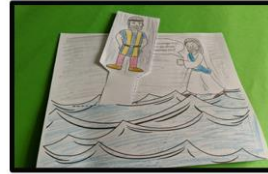
What to do:



Colour the template page.

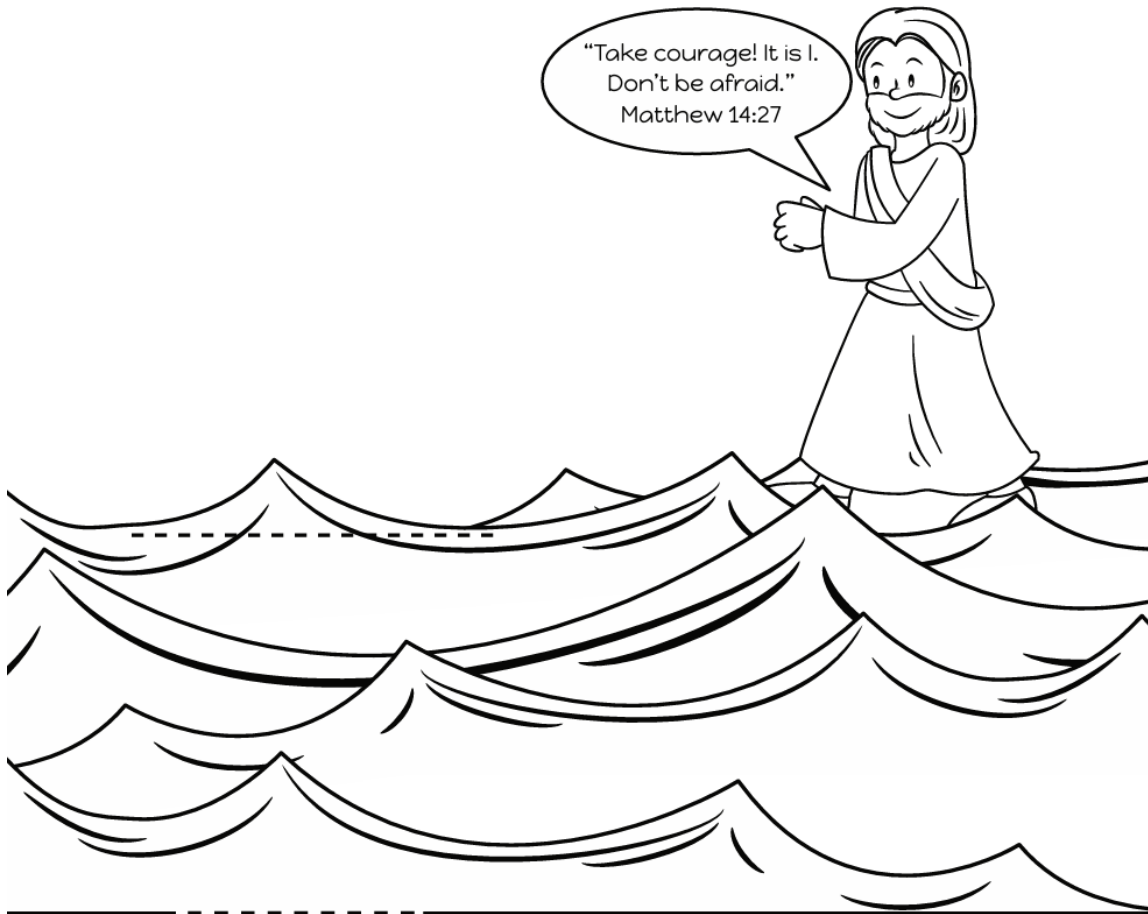


Cut along dotted lines.

St Paul was a tent maker but God wanted him to travel to other countries to tell people about Jesus. Paul made many journeys but it was not always easy for him.

Paul trusted in God even when things were difficult or unclear. He visited Corinth and many people in Corinth came to believe in Jesus. Paul later wrote two letters to the church in Corinth, which are included in the Bible. Read the story.



In Corinth, Paul met a Jewish couple named Aquila and Priscilla, who were tentmakers like him.

They welcomed Paul into their home, and he worked with them to make tents.

Every Sabbath, Paul went to the synagogue to talk about Jesus.

But not everyone wanted to listen, and some were mean to him.



While Paul was sharing his message, he met Crispus, the leader of the synagogue.

Crispus listened carefully and decided to believe in Jesus!

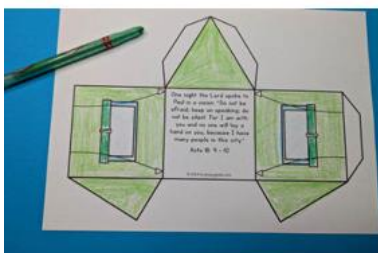
He asked Paul to baptise him.

Activity - make a Tent

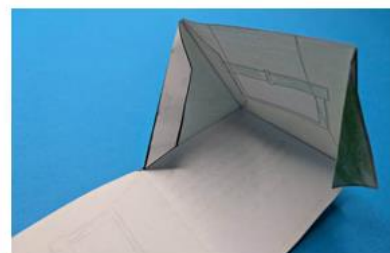
What to do:
